Teaching

English 15, Rhetoric and Composition (18 sections)

A rhetorically based experience in reading, writing, and multimedia composition for first-year students. Assignments taught include rhetorical analysis, annotated bibliography, position argument, productive counterargument, proposal, critical literacy narrative, multimedia evaluation, multimedia memoir, and infographic.

English 15E, Rhetoric and Composition, Enhanced (4 sections)

A developmental version of ENGL 15, designed for students who seek additional help on their writing, taught with an emphasis on critical literacy and linguistic justice. Assignments taught include critical literacy narrative, annotated bibliography, position argument, and infographic.

English 202C, Effective Writing: Technical Writing (4 sections)

An advanced writing course for students entering professions in science and engineering, with an emphasis on rhetorical principles for effective communication. Assignments taught include rhetorical analysis, internet resource guide, technical definition/description, instruction set, and job application package.

An advanced writing course for majors, and non-majors, and graduate students interested in careers as writers or editors, with an emphasis on accessible design. Assignments taught include instruction set, infographic, research design plan, usability test report, and eportfolio.
